II. LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS: Our Legislative Committee has 3 full time members and one part time. They met in early August to plan meetings, with the four General Assembly members and our state Senator after the fall elections, to discuss the State and National PLO's. The Committee Chairman has met with Congressman Robert Hurt (5th District) and reviewed the JLC approved National PLO's. We advocate a Congressional review of the Veteran's Administration's delays in processing claims and other issues.

III. PUBLIC AFFAIRS: The Daily Progress Newspaper had a story about bus service to the Pantops Veterans Affairs Clinic being restored after the route had been changed, causing Vets to walk nearly a mile to the clinic from the nearest bus stop. CVC's Legislative team led the relentless drumbeat to restore this service.

CVC President, Carl Huebner, proposed an article to the editor of The Daily Progress, referring to the recent announcement by the Administration, to cut the deficit by \$3 trillion over the next 10 years. The stated intent of this proposal is to "align government programs with those in the private sector" Carl's letter urges everyone to contact all elected officials to oppose this misguided attack against the forces that protect our National Security.

Our President attended the change of command ceremony at the Judge Advocate General Legal Center and School in Charlottesville .
