NEW VCOC TREASURER – Victoria Revilla

Victoria entered the Army Reserve in May 1970 and was commissioned in the Regular Army in 1971, with the Women's Army Corps Branch. She has commanded from the platoon to brigade level, served 4 years as the G-4, Director of Logistics for the Army Training Command and concluded her military career as the Special Assistant for Transformation to the Combined Arms Support Command; retiring in August 2001. For the last 5 years she has worked for the U.S. Army Installation Management Command as a contract Senior Logistics Analyst, developing operational concepts and doctrinal manuals. COL Revilla joined MOAA and the **Southside Virginia Chapter** in Sep 2000 and was elected to the Southside board of directors in Jan 2002. She has served as the chapter's Board President for the last five years, leading the chapter to three consecutive Five-Star Awards and four "Give Me 10" first place awards; this past year she has been the chapter representative on the VCOC. Victoria has also served three years as the board treasurer for a local non-profit theater and two years as the president of the Southside Virginia Council of the Arts, another non-profit organization. Managing resources is the key to sustaining an organization -- COL Revilla is **proud to serve** as the VCOC Treasurer.
