1. Legislative Affairs: Chapter members participated in local political meetings. These sessions serve to continue a positive and communicative relationship with these political leaders. COL Brown is on the Military advisory committee for VA Congressman Wittman. Other meetings involving National Security and military personnel issues have involved Speaker Bill Howell, Delegate Mark Cole, Senator Richard Stuart, and Senator Ed Houck.
2. Public Affairs: The Heritage Chapter published a newsletter and e-mailed it to the MOAA members in the local area to inform them the chapter's activities. The chapter utilized a web page linked off of the MOAA.org main web page to share information.
 - a) The HERITAGE Chapter coordinated and present 12 MOAA J-ROTC Certificates and Medal to outstanding J-ROTC participants in the Chapter area.
 - b) The HERITAGE Chapter coordinated a Reception for a Honor Flight of WWII and Korean War Veterans at the National Museum of the Marine Corps.
 - c) The HERITAGE Chapter conducted a Scholarship Evaluation program and awarded two \$500.00 Scholarship to outstanding J-ROTC Cadets in the Chapter Area.
 - d) The HERITAGE Chapter submitted the nomination form to National MOAA for a 5-Star Chapter designation.
 - e) The HERITAGE Chapter had three participants in the VCOC Congressional Luncheon.
3. Chapter Vitality & Levels of Excellence:
 - a) Self-Evaluation for the Quarter: The chapter member's complete feedback forms at meetings and officers use this information to enhance Chapter programs and activities.

The chapter established and publicized yearly goals (3), followed-up and reviewed its goals (1), planned and executed chapter activities (1), produced an annual schedule of activities before the first board meeting (1), has a P.O. box number to facilitate the receipt of correspondence (1), regularly conducted an official program or event six times a year (3), submitted an updated chapter officer listing to MOAA's Council and Chapter Affairs Department within 30 days of an election of new officers (3), elected MOAA members as officers and directors (5), chapter members are MOAA members (5), has a government relations liaison to receive and distribute MOAA's legislative information (1), presented legislative reports at each meeting and published in the newsletter (1), e-mailed a membership roster to MOAA's Council and Chapter Affairs Department (3), requested recruiting assistance from MOAA; mailing lists (1), has greeters for social activities to welcome new members (1), followed up with individuals who did not renew their membership (1), presented medals, ribbons, and/or certificates to deserving participants in ROTC or Junior ROTC programs (1), has an established scholarship program (1), regularly published a newsletter (3), set up an electronic network of communication (3).
