IV. Chapter Vitality & Levels of Excellence:

Chapter Vitality: Self-evaluation Status: Evaluation was conducted in March 2010 - Score 64. Chapter needs to reduce number of lapsed MOAA members, establish a TOPS liaison program, and interface with the Chambers of Commerce and other appropriate agencies.

Levels of Excellence: Chapter score is 230 (5-Star) Chapter needs to reduce the number of lapsed MOAA members to less than twelve (12) to achieve maximum score of 240 points.
